Incidents

9/26/2023 – Welsh Road/Prudential Drive (Upper Dublin) – Upper Dublin Police Officers located a vehicle that was registered to a male subject that was wanted by Springfield Police – Detective Division. The wanted subject was taken into custody and turned over to Springfield Police for that warrant.

9/27/2023 – 1400 block Bethlehem Pike – While on patrol, Officers located a vehicle parked in front of several businesses that were closed. Officers contacted the operator of the vehicle to ensure that no illegal activity was taking place. After checking the operator for wants/warrants with negative results, they were sent on their way without issue.

9/27/2023 – Pennsylvania Avenue/Lynn Avenue – Officers from Springfield and Upper Dublin responded to the area for reports of shots fired. Multiple calls were received but no one was able to provide a description of the suspect nor vehicles fleeing the area. Several Officers canvassed the area and located a shell casing. Detectives responded to assist in processing the scene. This incident is under investigation by the Detective Division.

9/28/2023 – 1800 block Bethlehem Pike – While on patrol, Officers located an occupied vehicle to the rear of a closed business. Officers contacted the two parties to see why they were there. After checking both parties for wants/warrants, they were sent on their way without issue.

9/28/2023 – 7700 block Queen Street – Officers were dispatched to the area for reports of shots fired. Both Springfield and Cheltenham Officers responded to the reports. Several Cheltenham Officers noticed fireworks in the area of the reports. Springfield Officers canvassed the area to ensure the public's safety and it was determined that the fireworks were mistaken for gunshots.

9/28/2023 – 1801 Paper Mill Road – Springfield Township High School – Officers were dispatched to the stadium locker rooms at the Springfield Township High School (after hours) after there was a report of people being seen on camera walking around the field house. Officers quickly responded to the area but were unable to locate anyone there. Officers will remain in contact with District Security to locate any subjects involved in this incident.

9/29/2023 – Allison Road – Officers responded to the area for a report of a theft from a local business. As a patron was dining with their child, a subject entered the vestibule area and stole a scooter that they brought with them. Officers checked the area but were unable to locate the suspect nor the scooter. Camera footage shows the incident and responding Officers are in the process of attempting to identify the actor.

10/1/2023 – Stenton Avenue/Northwestern Avenue – While on patrol, Officers located a vehicle that was on fire in the area. Both the Flourtown Fire Company and Philadelphia Fire Department were dispatched to the incident. It was determined by PFD Engine 37 and Springfield Police that the vehicle was in Philadelphia and was turned over to their agencies after the incident was deemed safe.
