
Board of Commissioners,



New Business:

Case #22-03: This is the application of **William & Cathy Murphy**, owners of a vacant lot on Carolton Way, known as Parcel #52-00-03025-01-9, and located in the A – Residential District of Ward #6 of Springfield Township ("Property"). The applicants request the following relief to construct a single-family dwelling with attached garage and rear deck on the Property. (1) An appeal of the Zoning Officer's determination that section 114-12B3.A "Regulations for Areas of Steep Slopes" is applicable to the development of the Property, based on the approved and recorded subdivision plan, or in the alternative a variance from section 114-12B3.A to permit more than 40% of the total lot area to be regraded; and (2) a variance from section 114-54.A(1) "Front Yards" to permit a 30' front yard setback rather than the required 40'.

SCOPE OF WORK

- A. Conduct Existing Trails Inventory
 - Tasks
 - MCPC with the help of working group will identify and assess the existing system of both local and county trails and recreational areas/venues in Springfield Township and its adjacent municipalities that could potentially connect to a trail network in Springfield Township.
 - MCPC will assess current trail usage patterns for existing township, county, and other trails in and adjacent to Springfield Township via a public survey.
 - MCPC will use SurveyMonkey and/or Wikimapping to identify trail usage and preferences.
 - o MCPC will map:
 - Existing Trails, Proposed Trails and Sidewalks
 - Existing Open Space and Greenways
 - Existing Employment Centers, Shopping Centers
 - Existing Environmental Features such as Floodplains, Water Features and Woodlands
 - Relevant Public Engagement & Meetings
 - o Task Force Meeting #1
 - o Outreach Survey and/or Wikimapping
 - o Internal Coordination Meetings
 - Deliverable
 - Existing Local/County Trail Inventory

B. Gap Analysis and List of Recommended Trail Improvements

 - MCPC will identify gaps in the overall trail system (including Township sidewalk and bike infrastructure network) based on the location of public parks, open space, and key destinations (e.g., employment centers).

C. Create an Updated Trail Network Map and Trail Improvement Recommendations

 - MCPC will create a list of recommended locations comprised of publicly and privately owned land where future trail improvements/development could be incorporated to improve the connectivity of public parks, greenspaces, neighborhoods, employment centers, shopping areas, and other community resources within Springfield Township as well as possible connections to planned and/or established trail networks owned by Montgomery County or neighboring municipalities
 - MCPC will prepare a final color rendering concept map and color aerial map of the Township depicting existing local/county trails and recommended improvements identified as part of the Gap Analysis and feedback from public outreach. Additional maps depicting specific improvements and/or sections of the Township may also be requested and/or included in the final report. The maps are to be provided in paper and digital format suitable for mass reproduction by the Township.

Outreach will likely include virtual engagement methods including surveys, online mapping tools and exercises, and an in-person public planning workshop. Additional public workshops or events can be added at the request of the Township.

MCPC will present the draft final study to the Springfield Township Board of Commissioners at one of its regularly scheduled public meetings.
