INCIDENTS

3/18/24 – 700 block Pennsylvania Avenue (Whitemarsh Township) – Several Officers from Springfield, Upper Dublin, and Whitemarsh Police Departments were dispatched to the area for a vehicle crash involving an overturned car. Further reports informed responding units that a party was still entrapped in the car after it overturned. Officers and multiple Fire Department Units arrived on scene to render aid to the driver. After further investigation, the crash was determined to be in Whitemarsh Township. Springfield Units remained on scene for assistance and were released to normal patrol operations.

3/23/24 – 500 block Cheltenham Avenue (Cheltenham Township) – Several Springfield Officers responded along with Cheltenham Police after an “Officer Needs Assistance” was broadcasted via county radio. Cheltenham Officers were able to get the situation under control prior to Springfield Officers arriving on scene. The Springfield Units were quickly resumed to normal patrol operations.

3/25/24 – Route 309, mile marker 3.3 – Officers from the Springfield, Upper Dublin, Whitemarsh, and Cheltenham Police Departments responded along with the Pennsylvania State Police after a report of a road rage incident that took place on Route 309. It was also reported that the aggressor in this incident displayed a firearm and discharged a round into the air during the incident. Springfield Officers continued canvassing the area for the suspect’s vehicle but were unable to locate it. The incident was turned over to the Pennsylvania State Police due to it occurring on Route 309.
