INCIDENTS

4/23/24 – Bethlehem Pike/E Wissahickon Avenue – Officers conducted a traffic stop after observing a vehicle nearly strike a pole. After speaking with the female operator, Officers noticed signs of impairment. Subsequently, the Officers conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tests which also indicated signs of impairment. The female operator was taken into custody under the suspicion of DUI.

4/24/24 – 9800 block Germantown Pike – Officers were dispatched to the area along with Whitemarsh Police, Cheltenham Police, and the Philadelphia Police Department after receiving reports of shots fired in the area. Several Officers arrived on location and began checking the area for activity. Whitemarsh Police utilized their drones to survey the area as well. Nothing of evidentiary value was located and Officers continued to canvass the area for further activity.

4/24/24 – 9800 block Germantown Pike – Officers were dispatched to the area after receiving reports of a vehicle that was stolen overnight. Due to the delay of the report, Officers distributed the vehicle description to surrounding agencies and entered it into NCIC as stolen.

4/24/24 – 1300 block Bethlehem Pike – Officers were notified and dispatched to a local bank for a reported robbery in progress. When Officers arrived on scene, the suspect had already fled, but were able to confirm reports that an attempted robbery occurred. This incident is currently under investigation by the Springfield Township Police Department Detective Division in collaboration with the Federal Bureau of Investigations.

4/27/24 – W. Wissahickon Avenue/Rose Lane – While on patrol, Officers observed a male urinating on a vehicle after being seen behind the wheel. Officers contacted the male and detected signs of intoxication. Standardized Field Sobriety Tests were conducted, which showed signs of impairment. The male was ultimately taken into custody under the suspicion of DUI.
