INCIDENTS:

5/7/25 – A male turned himself in at our police station for a local warrant and was transported to the county prison.

5/8/25 – The Supervisor of Campus Safety for Springfield Township High School came to the police station to report an assault that took place at the high school. After officers viewed surveillance video and spoke with the involved students and their parents, one juvenile was taken into custody and charged with simple assault.

5/8/25 – 5/11/25 – Along with other local police, Springfield officers were assigned to a special detail in Whitemarsh Township at the Philadelphia Cricket Club for the Truist Championship.

5/8/25 – Police were dispatched to Halligan's Pub on the 1600 block of Bethlehem Pike for the report of a stolen wallet. The customer was described the person who was seated near her in the restaurant at the time her wallet went missing, who did not order anything. The customer's husband went outside and saw them drive away and gave a description to the police. The customer later called police again when her bank notified her of activity on her credit cards at the Walmart in Cheltenham. Springfield and Cheltenham officers responded and saw the vehicle in the parking lot. The female exited the Walmart, and the victim made a positive ID on this female. She was taken into custody for Access Device Fraud, Identity Theft, and other related charges.

5/11/25 – While patrolling the area of Bethlehem Pike and McCloskey Ave, an officer observed a vehicle traveling on Bethlehem Pike without its taillights on. The officer initiated a traffic stop and while speaking with the driver, the driver admitted to having drugs in the vehicle. The driver consented to a search of the vehicle. The driver was taken into custody for possession of narcotics and drug paraphernalia.
