## **INCIDENTS:**

5/28/25 – The Mongomery County Sheriff's Department was serving a warrant on the 200 block of Sunnybrook Rd. The parents of the male lied to the sheriffs about his whereabouts, and he was found hiding in the house. A male and female were taken into custody for hindering apprehension.

5/28/25 – Police were dispatched to an unconscious subject in a vehicle on the 800 block of Bethlehem Pike. The male in the driver's seat was completely passed out upon police arrival. After calling out to him a few times, he gained consciousness. While speaking with the driver, officers noticed slurred speech and bloodshot eyes. While exiting the vehicle to be assessed by EMS, he was unsteady on his feet and needed to be helped to the curb. Officers then noticed a strong odor of alcoholic beverage on him and decided to administer the portable breath test. He was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI.

5/29/25 – Police were dispatched to a report of theft at Giant on the 1800 block of Bethlehem Pike. Upon arrival, the shoplifter was in the office with employees. The employee witnessed the male pretend to ring up merchandise and only pay for a few items out of the many he had. He was taken into custody for retail theft.

5/30/25 – Police were dispatched to the parking lot of the North Hills Country Club on Station Ave for the report of a physical altercation. There were four people in the parking lot who were uncooperative in providing a story and denied physically fighting. Two of the subjects identified had active warrants out of Mongomery and Chester counties. Once both warrants were confirmed, these two males were taken into custody to serve their warrants.
