INCIDENTS:

7/3/25 – Police were dispatched to Walgreens on the 1400 block of Bethlehem Pike for a theft-in-progress. The manager told police that the female left the store and got in her vehicle, which was still in the parking lot. Since the female cooperated and returned the items, the store decided not press charges. The female was told not to return to the store.

7/4/25 – While on patrol, an officer observed a vehicle sitting at the intersection of Station Ave and Mt. Carmel Ave. The car did not move after a full light cycle, so the officer approached to check on the driver. The vehicle was in drive, the driver was asleep, and there appeared to be an empty alcoholic beverage can in the cup holder. Upon waking up, the officers observed glassy eyes and the odor of alcohol and therefore administered field sobriety tests. The male was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI.

7/6/25 – Police were dispatched to the unit block of Red Oak Rd for suspicious activity. Police were advised there were two subjects trying car door handles. While enroute to the call, a stolen vehicle passed an officer but fled at a high rate of speed when the officer attempted to initiate a stop. The caller met with police and described the subjects, their vehicle, and said that they gained entry to at least one vehicle. Officers surveyed the area and found that multiple vehicles had been broken into/rummaged through. These have been reported, turned over to the Detective Bureau and the investigation is ongoing.
