INCIDENTS:

8/13/25 – Police were dispatched to the area of Church Rd and Paper Mill Rd for a disabled vehicle that had run out of gas. The driver and passenger asked for a ride to buy gas. When the officer ran their ID's through the system, it was discovered that the male had a warrant for his arrest out of Chester County. Officers confirmed the warrant and took the male into custody for his warrant.

8/13/25 – Police were dispatched to the 1400 block of Willow Grove Ave to check on a female staggering and walking into the roadway with a bottle of alcohol in her hand. Officers made contact with the female and noticed she had bloodshot eyes and could not maintain her balance. During the investigation, the female kept giving false identification to officers. While interacting with officers, the female attempted to dispose of a bag of narcotics. The female was taken into custody for possession and false identification.

8/14/25 – Police were dispatched to the WSFS Bank on the 1300 block of Bethlehem Pike for a report of check fraud. The bank told officers that the female had left, was on her way back, and provided the female's description and license plate. The female pulled back into the parking lot but took off after seeing the police vehicle. Police initiated a traffic stop, confirmed the identity of the female, and took her into custody for counterfeit and identity theft.

8/16/25 – Police were dispatched to the Wawa on the 1600 block of Bethlehem Pike for a report of juveniles in possession of alcoholic beverages. The dispatcher relayed the type of vehicle the juveniles were in and that they were offering beers to patrons outside of the Wawa. Police arrived and the driver of the vehicle told police there was no alcohol involved. Officers could see multiple beer cans in plain view and directed the juveniles to sit along the curb. The juvenile driver then opened a beer and started drinking it in front of the officers. The others admitted to drinking the beer and were coming from a party. The juveniles were released to a parent and charged with underage drinking.
