INCIDENTS:

9/2/2025 – Police and EMS were dispatched to the 8800 block of Stenton Ave for a possible overdose. The female, located in the driver's seat was evaluated and refused EMS services. The male was transported to the hospital. Upon investigation, the officer observed drug paraphernalia in the vehicle in plain view. The female admitted to having more drugs and paraphernalia with her. She was taken into custody for possession of a controlled substance and paraphernalia.

9/5/2025 – Police were dispatched to the 100 block of W Wissahickon Ave for a female wandering who was almost struck by a vehicle. The female was found wearing a hospital gown but denied being in the hospital recently. After identifying herself, officers discovered that she had an arrest warrant out of Philadelphia. After receiving confirmation, the female was taken into custody for her warrant.

9/5/2025 – Police were dispatched to a vehicle accident involving an overturned vehicle in the area of Trumbauer Ct and Duveen Dr. Officers arrived and spoke with the driver and a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage was coming from her breath. The female admitted to consuming alcohol and had no recollection of how she crashed. The female denied EMS transport and was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI.

9/5/2025 – Police were dispatched to W Wissahickon Ave for a report of a runaway female. Upon arrival, officers ran the registration plates of the vehicles in the driveway to obtain the caller's information. One of the registration tags came back to a male that had a warrant out of Chester County. The male that matched the PennDOT picture answered the door. The male stated that the female had returned and no longer needed to be reported. After police confirmed the identification of the male, they confirmed the warrant. The male was taken into custody to serve his warrant.
