INCIDENTS:

10/08/2025 – While on patrol, an officer observed a vehicle driving at a higher speed than the other traffic on Willow Grove Ave. The vehicle had heavy tint on all windows including the windshield. The officer got behind the vehicle and could smell an odor of burnt marijuana emanating. The vehicle kept speeding up to go through yellow lights. The officer conducted a traffic stop for equipment violations and repetitive aggressive driving behavior. The odor was present in the vehicle and the officer could see multiple roaches and a joint in plain sight. The driver stopped cooperating but eventually did step out of the vehicle. Some standard field sobriety tests were administered until he refused to continue. A small crowd formed, and a female was impeding with the DUI investigation. The driver was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI, and he finished his sobriety tests at the police station.

10/11/2025 – Police were dispatched to the wooded area of Stenton Ave between Overlea Way and Whitemarsh Drive for a group of kids partying. Police arrived and observed multiple kids that appeared to be juveniles. Multiple juveniles were observed inside and outside one of the homes with open beer cans in their hands. The juvenile who lived at the house admitted that she was having a party with underage drinking. Each juvenile took a breath test, and those with the presence of alcohol on their breath were referred to the Youth Aid Panel. Officers ensured all parties had sober rides home and EMS was dispatched to tend to one juvenile.
