INCIDENTS:

6/23/2026 – While on patrol, an officer conducted a traffic stop on the 800 block of Bethlehem Pike for an inoperable taillight. Before approaching the vehicle, the officer detected a strong odor of burnt marijuana coming from the vehicle. The driver had admitted to smoking and handed the officer a warm marijuana cigarette. The officer could see other roaches in the vehicle. The driver agreed to a consent search of the vehicle and standard field sobriety tests. Due to the results, the driver was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI, possession of a controlled substance, and other related charges.

6/24/2026 – Police were dispatched to Wawa on the 1600 block of Bethlehem Pike for a report of a vehicle that was stolen and returned. The employee noticed their car was in a different spot than they left it in that morning. They realized they accidentally left the keys inside the vehicle and found items that belonged to a female on the seat. After reviewing video footage, a female took the car and returned it later in the day. The investigation is ongoing.

6/24/2026 – Springfield Police assisted Cheltenham Police with putting up a drone to locate a stolen vehicle suspect. The suspect was taken into custody.

6/26/2026 – Police took multiple reports of vehicles broken into overnight in the Wyndmoor section of the township.

6/27/2026 – Police were dispatched to a vehicle crash in the area of Bethlehem Pike and Chesney Ln. One driver was not verbally responding to officers at first, then leaned over the center console. The driver took his foot off of the break and the vehicle started to roll backward. The driver did not put the car in park as officers requested. When they opened the door to put the car in park, the male threw himself out of the vehicle and the officer stopped the vehicle before it injured the male. The male admitted to taking a controlled substance. The driver was transferred to the hospital and DUI charges are pending investigation.
