INCIDENTS:

9/15/2026 – While on patrol on the 900 block of Bethlehem Pike, an officer observed a vehicle driving without rear lights on. The officer initiated a traffic stop and the officer observed signs of impairment while speaking with the driver. The driver agreed to Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI, Driving Without a License, and other charges.

9/15/2026 – Police were dispatched to the 400 block of Hillcrest Ave for the report of a suspicious person. Police found the male sitting at the front of a property stating he was waiting for someone, thinking that they lived at that property. Upon further investigation, that person did not live there and the male on scene had an active arrest warrant out of Philadelphia. He was taken into custody for his arrest warrant.

9/17/2026 – Police were dispatched to the Flourtown Shopping Center for a child that was left unattended in a vehicle and was hanging halfway out of the window. Police arrived and the mother of the child came out approximately five minutes later. The female was charged with Leaving a Child Unattended in Vehicle.

9/19/2026 – Police were dispatched to the area of Suffolk Rd near Greenhill Rd for two vehicles driving erratically and juveniles running through the neighborhood. Upon arrival, police observed juveniles in the driveway of a house attempting to enter a vehicle. Once the officer stepped out of the vehicle, the juveniles piled into two vehicles and crashed into one another. Both vehicles then took off. The officer turned the corner and saw one of those vehicles hit a parked car and flipped onto two wheels. In the process, the tire of that vehicle came off and hit the police vehicle. The vehicle started to drive away with three wheels, but police caught up. The juveniles fled on foot, and one was taken into custody. Whitmarsh PD and Cheltenham PD arrived to assist with the search. A Whitmarsh officer on a K9 track was able to locate one of the other juveniles hiding in shrubbery and he was taken into custody. Both juveniles were charged with Receiving Stolen Property, Fleeing or Eluding an Officer, and other related charges. After this, multiple reports were taken of theft from vehicles in the area of Greenhill Rd and Preston Rd. The case has been turned over to the Detective Bureau and the investigation is ongoing.
